Mountain Country in Style – 4 Day and Daily Tours

a) Mountain Country in Style – 4 Day Hiking and Drive Trails (Monday 30th

September to Thursday 3rd October 2024)

Tag-along drive and walking trails with a combination of nature based bushwalking and driving experiences enjoying Mountain Country in style. We visit a variety of locations within the **Stirling and Porongurup Range** such as climbing **Bluff Knoll, Mt Trio and Mt Hassell** along with a 20+km walk through the amazing ranges followed by a walk up **Castle Rock Skywalk** viewing the incredible Great Southern landscapes.

Itinerary

Day 1 "Place of Many Eyes" (Monday 30th September)

- Meet for morning tea at **Bluff Knoll Cafe** at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- Bluff Knoll, the highest peak being 1099 metres above sea level. It is known as the 'place of many eyes'
 or Pualaar Miial, by Indigenous Noongar people. We enjoy the panoramic views of the surrounding
 plains and see if we can spot black cockatoos, birds of prey, purple-crowned lorikeets, scrub wrens and
 other birds in their natural habitat
- We meet our local Indigenous guide who will tell the local **Goreng** story of the mountains before we climb to the peak and enjoy the stunning views and rugged terrain taking a lunch break before we head back down the mountain
- Once we arrive back in the carpark we take a coffee break at **Bluff Knoll Cafe** before heading across the road for a visit and walking tour experiencing local fauna and flora with local owners Virginia and Darren at the nearby **Stirling Range Retreat** which has some interesting accommodation and other features
- We then depart for our accommodation at various locations to end the day

Day 2 Mt Trio, Ranges and Trails in Mountain Country (Tuesday 1st October)

- Meet for morning tea at Bluff Knoll Cafe at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- We then head to Mt Trio to prepare to climb the mountain to take in the mountain vista from another perspective
- We climb to the peak and enjoy the stunning views and rugged terrain taking a lunch break before we head back down the mountain
- Once we descend we drive around to another trail and Mt Hassell to climb for some afternoon fun
- Later that afternoon we take a coffee break (time permitting) at the local **Bluff Knoll Cafe** before settling in to our accommodation to end the day

Day 3 Bushwalking seeing Nature at its Best (Wednesday 2nd October)

- Meet for morning tea at Bluff Knoll Cafe at 9.00am
- Then we assemble for a big day of trekking taking our packed lunch and all the extras to see us through a
 big day out in nature experiencing the enchanted beauty of the Stirling Range with a long walk along
 one of the tracks
- We drive to White Gum Flats Picnic Area where we commence a walk along the Nth Henton track past
 Mt Magog and then take a lunch break
- After a refreshing break we commence to walk along the Yetemerup Track between Twin Hills and The
 Abbey back to Stirling Range Drive
- We arrive back at our original starting point and return to our base so a trek of around 22kms
- Later that afternoon we take a coffee break (time permitting) at the local Bluff Knoll Cafe before we take
 a return trip to Mt Trio Bush Camp for a similar visit to meet Margot and Partner along with a walk
 around viewing their property viewing the accommodation and fauna and flora

We then depart for our accommodation at various locations

Day 4 Day of Trails and Fun! (Thursday 3rd October)

- The **Shire of Plantagenet**, named after the Anjou region in France, offers gorgeous landscapes, quality produce and spectacular views. Learn about the Plantagenet and adjoining regions, its early colonial past and first nation's peoples, view stunning landscapes and experience a meeting with a local vigneron
- Meet for morning tea at **Bluff Knoll Cafe** at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- Then travel south toward the **Kalgan River** (with a stop and talk) on the way to **Castle Rock Skywalk** for a walk up the Skywalk
- Late lunch is taken at Ironwood Winery where tastings and a glass of wine provides an experience of a
 local vigneron with the intense varietal fruit flavours of the mineral-rich wines of the local Porongurup
 Range wine producer
- We then depart down Knights Road and along the Kalgan River back to the Stirling Range and our accommodation at various locations

Meet at Bluff Knoll Cafe 9.00am with departure at 9.30am and return by 4.30pm each day (minimum 15 adults)

b) Local Daily Sightseeing Tours Featuring different Themes – Cultures, Food and Wine, Nature and Wildlife and Artwork (Tag-along tour)

Day 1 Features of Ongerup - the Malleefowl Centre and Railway Museum (Friday 4th October)

- Meet for morning tea at Bluff Knoll Cafe at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- Travel via Borden with a stop and talk at the Pallinup River on the way to Ongerup and the Yongergnow
 Malleefowl Centre for lunch and a tour of the Sanctuary the sanctuary is part of the National
 Malleefowl Recovery Program to protect endangered Malleefowl and their habitat.
- This country is known for the massive deforestation or clearing of vast ecologically rich and diverse Eucalyptus Mallee country. The Education Centre has some wonderful displays of the history of the region
- We then take a walk to view wildflowers on the trail outside the Centre followed by a visit to the
 Ongerup Railway Museum and Wildflower Display (usually part of the Bloom Festival) along with
 afternoon tea
- We then depart for our accommodation at various locations

Day 2 Features of the Porongurup Range (Saturday 5th October)

- The **Shire of Plantagenet**, named after the Anjou region in France, offers gorgeous landscapes, quality produce and spectacular views. Learn about the Plantagenet and adjoining regions, its early colonial past and first nation's peoples, view stunning landscapes and experience a meeting with a local vigneron
- Meet for morning tea at **Bluff Knoll Cafe** at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- Then travel south toward the **Kalgan River** (with a stop and talk) on the way to **Castle Rock Skywalk** for a walk up the Skywalk
- We then travel just up the road for a late lunch and wine tastings at Ironwood Winery
- The return trip is down Knights Road along the Kalgan River Valley back to the Stirling Range
- We then depart for our accommodation at various locations

Day 3 Features of the Shire – the Horsepower Highway, Gnowangerup and other Unique Features of the Local Region (Sunday 6th October)

- Meet for morning tea at **Bluff Knoll Cafe** at 9.00am
- Travel to **Bluff Knoll car park lookout** to take in the incredible views
- Then travel across the road for a visit and walking tour experiencing local fauna and flora with local owners Virginia and Darren at the nearby Stirling Range Retreat which has some interesting accommodation and other features
- We take a tour along the **Horsepower Highway** to **Gnowangerup** with stops at various locations to inspect and take photos of the art work with the tractors and water tanks
- We then arrive in Gnowangerup to visit the **Indigenous Art and Cultural Centre** where lunch is taken with a local community group
- After a nice lunch and meet and greet we take a return trip to Mt Trio Bush Camp for a similar visit to
 meet Margot and Partner along with a walk around viewing their property viewing the accommodation
 and fauna and flora
- We then depart for our accommodation at various locations
